

#### God Is Still Speaking!

When people hear that I am preaching on a movie, quite a few of them tilt their heads in confusion and curiosity. Then they ask, "How? How could a talk on a movie be a message from a pulpit?" For those who have a traditional viewpoint on preaching, a sermon must begin and end with the Bible. A preacher could use movies, novels, and news on the media as an illustration of his/her message, but the core message should be found and grounded in the Holy Scripture. I strongly agree with these points. I believe a message on Sunday morning cannot be a talk reflecting the personal opinion of a preacher, but should be solidly grounded in the Good Book. But my conviction on biblical preaching does not go against my idea of developing a sermon on movies. Here is why.

God is still speaking, and S/He is speaking not only through the Good Book but also through things in this world. Theologians named this kind of thought as sacramental theology. The moon, sun, and stars keep telling how great our God is. The changing of seasons teaches us of God's faithfulness. Bread and wine on the altar preach how merciful and gracious our Lord is. Hugging our family in the morning, we hear God's message: "I love you!" Sharing a meal with those who are not as fortunate as we are, we see ourselves being a vehicle of God's message of love. The movie is one of millions and zillion of things that God is speaking through. What we hear from these things in the world does not go against the message in the Bible. Instead, the divine word in things confirms and strengthens the word from the Bible. This is why I do not hesitate to develop a sermon on things like movies, songs, and paintings.

When we expand this idea of sacramental theology, we can say that a pastor is not the only one who finds God's message. God is speaking to everyone as well as through everything, and everyone is capable of hearing His/Her voice, whispering to our heart, because of His/Her Grace that comes before us. For this reason, I'd like to invite you to share with me the message that you found in the classic Christmas movie, "It's a Wonderful Life." I believe most of you have watched this movie more than once. What did this movie teach you? Why do you like it or not? And why do you think this movie inspires so many people through generations?

Please, feel free to share the message that you found. I will make four Advent sermons based on your sharing. Thank you for your active participation in advance!
